To the Public Utility Commission of Oregon:

Thank you for guiding the implementation of the Oregon Community Solar Program (the “CSP”). As Vice, President and Head of US Solar Operations of SPI Solar, Inc., (“SPI”) I am pleased to report that SPI is promoting 5 projects for participation in the CSP. Our projects Manchester Solar, Clayfield Solar, Dover Solar, Waterford Solar and Cork Solar. In aggregate, these projects will provide 13.88 total megawatts of nameplate capacity to the CSP, specifically in the service territory of the Portland General Electric Company (“PGE”). We look forward to continuing to see these projects, and the CSP, advance.

I understand that PGE has proposed a tariff that would change the allocation of CSP costs across PGE’s customer base. Manchester Solar, Clayfield Solar, Dover Solar, Waterford Solar and Cork Solar believe that the CSP furthers decarbonization of energy supply in Oregon and provides a public benefit and a public good that benefits all customers. Manchester Solar, Clayfield Solar, Dover Solar, Waterford Solar and Cork Solar do not take a position on PGE’s proposed tariff, but do support the Commission and PGE considering responsibility of program costs.
