RE: PGE Advice No. 20-09, Schedule 136 Oregon Community Solar Program Cost Recovery Mechanism, updates title of schedule and the type of costs to recover to include payments to participants, Docket No. ADV 1112

To the Public Utility Commission of Oregon:

Thank you for guiding the implementation of the Oregon Community Solar Program (the "CSP"). As Manager of Sulus Solar I am pleased to report that Sulus Solar is promoting 4 projects for participation in the CSP. Our projects include: Belvedere Solar, Cusack Solar, Auburn Solar and Ashfield Solar. In aggregate, these projects will provide 10.49 total megawatts of nameplate capacity to the CSP, specifically in the service territory of the Portland General Electric Company ("PGE"). We look forward to continuing to see these projects, and the CSP, advance.

I understand that PGE has proposed a tariff that would change the allocation of CSP costs across PGE's customer base. Belvedere Solar, Cusack Solar, Auburn Solar and Ashfield Solar believe that the CSP furthers decarbonization of energy supply in Oregon and provides a public benefit and a public good that benefits all customers. Belvedere Solar, Cusack Solar, Auburn Solar and Ashfield Solar do not take a position on PGE's proposed tariff, but do support the Commission and PGE considering responsibility of program costs.
