COMMENTS OF ELECTRIC LIGHTWAVE, LLC

Pursuant to the Chief Administrative Law Judge's Ruling issued September 20, 2006 (the "Ruling"), Electric Lightwave, LLC hereby submits the following comments on proposed revisions to certain sections of Division 28 of Chapter 860 of the Oregon Administrative Rules relating to sanctions. Electric Lightwave bases its comments on the proposal submitted by the Oregon Joint Use Association ("OJUA") to Commission Staff on September 12, 2006.

Electric Lightwave appreciates the work done by the OJUA and Staff to submit a proposal that pole owners and occupants can support. Although Electric Lightwave believes that monetary sanctions are not necessary and should be eliminated entirely, the OJUA's proposal reflects a reasonable compromise on certain contested issues. The proposed revisions to the sanctions rules generally would lower monetary sanctions, provide much needed certainty as to the amounts of penalties that may be imposed, and give occupants and owners more opportunities to correct violations before they incur substantial penalties. The proposed revisions also would eliminate the most perverse incentive in the current rules – the incentive for pole owners to terminate joint use contracts that have been in place for years solely to maximize the amount of penalties they may recover. The potential significant windfall that has been available to pole owners recently has resulted in an increase in the number of joint use disputes and has generally harmed the tradition of cooperative joint use in the state. Because they fix

1 some of the most egregious unintended problems with the current rules, Electric Lightwave 2 supports the OJUA's proposed revisions to the sanctions rules in their entirety. 3 Electric Lightwave understands that the OJUA proposal enjoys industry consensus and 4 supports it as a compromise proposal.
