Pursuant to Chief Administrative Law Judge (“ALJ”) Nolan Moser’s March 2, 2020 ruling in the above-referenced docket, the Alliance of Western Energy Consumers (“AWEC”) submits the following comments addressing PacifiCorp’s (“PacifiCorp” or “Company”) February 3, 2020 Oregon Transportation Electrification Plan (“TE Plan”).

I. INTRODUCTION

Under the Oregon Administrative Code, PacifiCorp must file its TE Plan for acceptance with the Public Utility Commission of Oregon (“Commission”).^{1/} PacifiCorp’s TE Plan must assess the “current condition of the transportation electrification market in [PacifiCorp’s] Oregon service territory”^{2/} with the necessary supporting data and analysis.^{3/}

II. COMMENTS

Under OAR 860-087-0200(2)(a), “acceptance” of PacifiCorp’s TE Plan “means the Commission finds that the TE Plan meets the criteria and requirements of this rule and does

not constitute a determination of the prudence of the individual actions discussed” The rule requires PacifiCorp’s TE Plan to include the following:

- (A) A discussion of existing state policies and programs;
- (B) Market barriers that the electric company can address and other barriers that are beyond the electric company's control, including any identified emerging challenges to transportation electrification;
- (C) Existing data on the availability and usage patterns of charging stations;
- (D) Number of electric vehicles of various sizes in the utility service territory and projected number of vehicles in the next five years;
- (E) Other transportation electrification infrastructure, if applicable;
- (F) Charging and vehicle technology updates; and
- (G) Distribution system impacts and opportunities for efficient grid management.^{4/}

Further, PacifiCorp’s TE Plan must include “[a] summary of [PacifiCorp’s] transportation electrification program(s) and future transportation electrification concepts and actions in its Oregon service territory...[and] incorporate project learnings and any other relevant information gathered from other transportation electrification infrastructure investments, programs, and actions to ensure that lessons learned are carried forward.”^{5/} Additionally, the Company’s TE Plan must discuss “how [PacifiCorp’s] investments, programs, and actions are expected to accelerate transportation electrification, address barriers to adoption, and extend

access to traditionally underserved communities.”^{6/} Further, the Oregon Administrative Rules require that PacifiCorp’s TE Plan discuss PacifiCorp’s “potential impact on the competitive electric vehicle supply equipment market,”^{7/} as well as system impacts of the Company’s TE Plan.^{8/} Finally, PacifiCorp must discuss the relationship between the Company’s TE Plan and Oregon’s carbon reduction goals and requirements.^{9/}

AWEC’s review of PacifiCorp’s TE Plan indicates that it complies with the strict requirements of the above-mentioned rules and, therefore, should be accepted by the Commission. AWEC emphasizes, however, that its recommendation for acceptance is based solely on the requirements of the rules and does not indicate support for any subsequent TE Program PacifiCorp proposes from its TE Plan, or the substantive conclusions of PacifiCorp’s TE Plan. AWEC will evaluate PacifiCorp’s subsequent TE Programs on their own merits when they are proposed.
