APPLICATION FOR RECONSIDERATION OF SMALL BUSINESS UTILITY ADVOCATES

I. INTRODUCTION

Pursuant to ORS 756.561 and OAR 860-001-0720, Small Business Utility Advocates ("SBUA") files this Application for Reconsideration ("Application") of the Public Utility Commission's ("Commission") Order Granting Case Certification ("Order") on the issue of intervenor funding in the above-referenced docket.¹ The Order grants the Petition of Small Business Utility Advocates for Case Certification ("Petition"), but notes that the balance of available funds in the PacifiCorp Issue Fund as of the date of the Order was less than \$100.²

SBUA requests that the Commission exercise its authority under 6.5 of the Fourth Amended and Restated Intervenor Funding Agreement to amend its Order by adding a provision that funds not spent from the 2020 and 2019 PacifiCorp issue funds be applied to the SBUA's Proposed Budget in UE 374 insofar as the Administrative Law Judge ("ALJ") finds the budget reasonable.

II. BACKGROUND

SBUA filed its Petition on March 10, 2020.³ The filing included as an incorporated attachment a Proposed Budget of approximately \$22,000.⁴ The Proposed Budget also included a balance of PacifiCorp Issue Funds available as of the date the Petition was filed, including the Commission staff's spreadsheet of funding levels as of March 10, 2020, which indicated \$144,424.80 in uncommitted funds remaining in the PacifiCorp Issue Fund.⁵ SBUA also filed on February 20, 2020 a Notice of Intent to Request Issue Fund Grant.⁶ The March 10, 2020 Petition was not opposed. The ALJ issued a Prehearing Conference Memorandum identifying April 27, 2020 as the deadline for Intervenors to file Proposed Budgets.⁷ As noted above, SBUA filed its Proposed Budget on March 10, 2020. Besides CUB, SBUA, and AWEC, no other intervenor sought intervention funding in this docket.

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On June 10, 2020, three months after the Petition was filed,⁸ the Commission granted SBUA's Case Certification but noted that the Issue Fund balance as of that date was less than \$100. SBUA filed a Public Records Request ("Request") and the Commission's staff responded to that Request ("Response") on June 26, 2020. The Response showed that the Issue Fund spreadsheet had been updated January 5, February 5, 2020, and May 12, 2020.⁹ As noted, SBUA filed its Petition and a Proposed Budget on March 10, 2020. The Response also shows when issue fund requests were received and granted, and indicates intervening parties are required to coordinate. Also, SBUA was available to, and did initiate reaching out pursuant to Section 6.6 of the Intervenor Funding Agreement to the Oregon Citizens' Utility Board ("CUB") and Alliance of Western Energy Consumers ("AWEC") to confer regarding cooperation but neither AWEC nor CUB saw opportunity to cooperate with SBUA.

III. TIMELINE AND ARGUMENT

- February 5, 2020—Request to Commission for General Rate Revision filed by PacifiCorp
- February 14, 2020 Issue Fund spreadsheet updated by Commission Staff
- February 21, 2020 -- Petition to Intervene filed by SBUA
- February 21, 2020 Notice of Intent to Request Issue Fund Grant filed by SBUA
- March 2, 2020 Order granting SBUA's Petition to Intervene
- March 6, 2020—Prehearing Conference Memorandum filed setting April 27, 2020 as deadline to file Proposed Budget for Intervenor Funding
- March 10, 2020 Petition of SBUA for Case Certification including Proposed Budget
- March 11, 2020—Pre-certified intervenor AWEC submits budget for Issue Fund grant
- March 11-13, 2020—ALJ approves other intervenor proposed budgets totaling \$114,900
- May 12, 2020 Issue Fund spreadsheet updated by Commission Staff

- June 6, 2020 Order by the Commission granting SBUA case certification but noting \$100 remaining in Intervention Funds
- July 29, 2020—Order approving payment of AWEC's funding grant

As the balance of intervention funds fluctuates it is reasonable to require the ALJ to specify the steps required to enable SBUA, now a case certified intervenor, to access issue grant funding in order to adequately represent the interests of small commercial customers in this general rate case. SBUA has in a previous docket set forth the context of the intervention issue funding purpose to enable effective participation in dockets, and SBUA incorporates this filing by reference.¹⁰ Given that case certification was granted, permitting SBUA to seek intervenor funding, it is fair and equitable to direct that the ALJ allocate issue funds available or made available in the 2020 and the 2019 PacifiCorp Issue Fund accounts to a reasonable SBUA budget in this docket (UE 374).

1. Grounds for Reconsideration

The Commission may review a decision with a consideration of all facts, including those arising since the former hearing, if the original order is in any respect unjust or unwarranted, and the Commission may reverse, change, or modify the same accordingly.¹¹ Among other possible reasons to grant this Application to reconsider the Order, new evidence relating to intervenor funding was obtained after the Order and good cause supports granting this Application.¹² In this case the Commission should modify its Order granting Case Certification and order that SBUA's

reasonable budget be paid from issue grant funds made available from funds remaining in the PacifiCorp Issue Fund accounts for 2020 and 2019.

2. Issue Funds Accounting

SBUA reasonably relied on the spreadsheet posted by Commission staff when SBUA filed its Petition on March 10, 2020. At that time, the spreadsheet reflected an estimate of uncommitted funds of \$144,424.80 in the PacifiCorp Issue Fund.¹³ Only after SBUA received its Response did SBUA learn the issue fund spreadsheet had not been updated in the amount of un committed PacifiCorp Issue funds between February 5 and May 12, 2020.14 The Response also shows that after SBUA filed its petition for case certification on March 10, 2020, Alliance of Western Energy Consumers ("AWEC") filed for its funding request in UE 375 on March 11, 2020. Per AWEC's request the Issue Fund on March 11, 2020 was estimated at \$21,000 and AWEC requested a budget of almost \$16,000.15 On March 11, 2020 in Order 20-073 the ALJ also granted in docket UM 2024 an Amended Issue Fund Grant from PacifiCorp Issue Fund to AWEC.¹⁶ As of the date of SBUA's filing its Petition including its Proposed Budget on March 10, 2020, the level of Issue Funds was presumably somewhere between \$144,424.80 and the amount approved for AWEC's funds. This amount could have supplied SBUA with all or most of its budget rather than only \$100.

3. Amending the Case Certification Order

The Commission may amend its Order granting case certification and enable SBUA to access funds from the PacifiCorp Issue Fund account.¹⁷ On July 8, 2020, the ALJ suspended UE 375¹⁸ and in so doing substantially reduced the work entailed in that docket as described in the ALJ's Prehearing Memorandum.¹⁹ Given the material change in that docket's schedule, the Commission should order funds not expended in UE 375 or another PacifiCorp docket, be applied to a reasonable budget presented by SBUA in this docket. In addition, the Commission should order that a reasonable SBUA budget be funded from the reallocation of remaining 2019 PacifiCorp Intervenor Issues Funds, as the Commission has done for other intervenor funding.²⁰

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IV. CONCLUSION

SBUA requests the Commission review and reconsider the Commission's timing of commitment of intervenor funding from the PacifiCorp Issue Fund and order that SBUA's reasonable budget be funded from funds remaining from the 2020 and 2019 Issue Funds. SBUA timely filed a petition for Case Certification, which included a Proposed Budget. Other intervenors and the Commission were given notice of SBUA's intent to request issue funds and no party will be prejudiced if the Commission orders funds to be paid. When SBUA filed its intent for issue funds, the Issue Fund estimated uncommitted funds of \$144,424.8.²¹ SBUA reasonably relied on the Commission's staff's statement of funds present in the Issue Fund when it requested funding. Also, both the 2019 and the 2020 funding accounts fluctuate. It is fair and equitable that SBUA be able to access this funding. For these reasons SBUA requests the Commission grant this Application.

The tracking spreadsheet posted on the PUC's website was updated on January 9, 2020, February 5, 2020, and May 12, 2020. The big gap in updates was due to increased workload and other working conditions caused by COVID-19 pandemic.

Under normal working conditions, the process for updating the spreadsheet is to update it when orders are issued addressing the intervenor funding filings.

On February 21, 2020, SBUA filed a Notice of Intent to Request an Issue Fund Grant in UE 374. SBUA filed for case certification on March 10, 2020.

Please note for SBUA's future information that Section 6.2 of the current applicable intervenor funding agreement (found online at <u>https://apps.puc.state.or.us/orders/2018ords/18-017.pdf</u>) states that an intervenor *who is not precertified must apply for case-certification on or before* the time it submits its notice of intent (Order No. 18-017, Appendix A, page 18) (emphasis added). Section 6.6 of the agreement encourages cooperation among the parties seeking intervenor funding.
