The Citizens' Utility Board of Oregon (CUB) requests a grant of \$11,100 from the 2009 PacifiCorp Issue Fund. This presumes a fully litigated case; settlement of some or all of the issues would likely reduce our total request for reimbursement. CUB staff will keep track of their participation by hours and activity.

CUB is precertified as per OAR 860-012-0100(3)(a). UE 177(3) is an eligible proceeding under the Intervenor Funding Agreement, adopted by the Commission on December 19, 2007 in Order No. 07-564, because the proceeding directly affects PacifiCorp, a participating public utility (Agreement 1(k)). CUB filed a Notice of Intent to Request a PacifiCorp Issue Fund Grant, as required by the Intervenor Funding Agreement (Agreement 6.2).

Pursuant to paragraph 6.3 of the Intervenor Funding Agreement, the proposed budget must identify certain points of information. We provide the information below.

(a) Statement Of Work To Be Performed: CUB intends to participate in every procedural aspect of this case. We participated in the pre-hearing conference. We will attend and participate in all or most workshops, settlement meetings, hearings, and Commission presentations. We will review and analyze PacifiCorp opening, and rebuttal testimony, and briefs. We will review and analyze testimony and briefs filed by other parties. We will pursue discovery of PacifiCorp through data requests, and will respond to data requests asked of us. We will file reply testimony, and briefs, and present our recommendations to the Commission, including any proposed modifications or conditions

(b) Description Of Areas To Be Investigated: CUB intends to investigate issues including, but not limited to:

- A. PacifiCorp's tax liability attributed to Oregon utility service;
- B. PacifiCorp's taxes that are charged to customers; and
- C. The effects of tax normalization.

(c) Description Of The Class Or Classes Benefiting From CUB's Participation:

CUB represents the interests of PacifiCorp's residential customers, though other customer classes may benefit from many aspects of our participation.

(d) The Fund From Which CUB Seeks An Issue Fund Grant & Available Funds: CUB is seeking an issue fund grant from the 2009 PacifiCorp Issue Fund. CUB is filing its final reimbursement for docket UE 210. In that docket, the PUC approved a budget of \$59,870 for CUB, but with the settlement of the docket, CUB's reimbursement is \$41,063. CUB is releasing the difference, \$18,800, which ensures that there are funds available for this budget.

(e) The Budget Showing Estimated Fees And Costs: CUB's budget accompanies this document as Attachment A.

(f) A Representation Of The Use Of Matching Funds: The budget and an accounting for the use of matching funds accompanies this document as Attachment A.
