Idaho Power Company filed with the Public Utility Commission of Oregon its 16 17 Request for a rate revision on December 23, 2019. 18 Pursuant to OAR 860-022-0017, Idaho Power Company caused to be published in the following newspapers of general circulation in the communities served by 19 20 Idaho Power Company (Argus Observer - Ontario, Oregon, Hells Canyon Journal -21 Halfway, Oregon, The Baker City Herald - Baker City, Oregon, and The Malheur Enterprise – Vale, Oregon) a display advertisement announcing the rate revision. The ad 22 23 ran in each of the newspapers on Wednesday, January 1, 2020. The ad size in the Argus Observer was 4.9 inches wide by 10 inches tall, 5.75 inches wide by 10 inches tall in the 24 25 Hells Canyon Journal, 5.25 inches wide by 10 inches tall in the Baker City Herald, and 4.9 inches wide by 10 inches tall in the Malheur Enterprise. It should be noted that for each 26

1	ad, the Company requested a size of three columns wide by ten inches tall. Due to varying
2	sizes of the publications themselves, the respective ad sizes vary. A copy of the display
3	announcement is attached to this Affidavit as Exhibit A (actual size published is listed
4	above).

Idaho Power's Oregon customers continue to receive a rate benefit resulting from federal tax rate changes that occurred in 2017. Idaho Power recently requested an increase of \$36,151 to the annualized Oregon jurisdictional benefits associated with tax reform, increasing the total benefit to more than \$1.5 million.

If this proposal is approved by the Oregon Public Utility Commission (OPUC) as filed, the typical Oregon residential customer using 1,150 kilowatt-hours of energy per month would see a \$0.06 decrease on their monthly bill beginning June 1.

Idaho Power's filing is subject to public review and OPUC approval. Copies of the application are available at OPUC offices (201 High St. SE, Suite 100, Salem, OR 97301-3398), the OPUC website (oregon.gov/puc), Idaho Power offices and Idaho Power's website (idahopower.com).
