Attached you will find a number of data slides and comparisons that show what could happen to Oregon ILECs and the rates that their customers would need to pay as a result of access reform and universal service reform. This data goes to the heart of demonstrating why this docket is very critical at this juncture.

In addition, OTA is including two slides that depict the TDS serving areas in Oregon of Asotin (Flora Troy) and Home operating companies. The purpose of these depictions is to underscore the role of density in providing universal service and meeting carrier of last resort obligations. As the reader can see from reviewing these depictions, there are extremely remote areas that are served in order to meet carrier of last resort obligations. While there may be pockets of populations that are relatively more dense (and that term is used loosely since the densities do not begin to approach major metropolitan areas), there are also vast regions of very low density.
