#### Purpose of Workshop

This workshop will discuss how Portland General Electric and Pacific Power implemented feedback received at the previous workshop in their 2022 plans to spend the money received from CFP credits. Forth will discuss how it is planning to spend unclaimed CFP credits Forth receives as Oregon Department of Environmental Quality’s (DEQ) Backstop Aggregator. Utilities in Oregon generate credits from residential customers who own electric vehicles. Credits are sold to companies that sell gasoline and diesel, creating a fund for programs that promote the adoption of electricity as a motor fuel.

After further stakeholder feedback at this workshop, the utilities will finalize their 2022 CFP plans and file them to the UM 1826 docket by November 19, 2021. Staff will report on this process to the Oregon Public Utility Commission (Commission) at the December 14, 2021 Public Meeting.

Launched in 2016, the CFP is run by the DEQ to reduce the carbon intensity of Oregon’s motor

vehicle fuels. In Order No. 18-376, the Commission required electric companies to participate in the CFP and present their CFP-financed programs for public review.
