# **Agent Subscription Model**

- Additional agreement that grants limited power of attorney to an agent to do one or more of following:
  - Administer the participant's electric utility account
  - Subscribe the participant to a project
  - Provide the participant with a consolidated bill, paid to the agent instead of the utility
- Commission approval required for use through CSP pre-certification or project modification process
- Decision is necessary in order to facilitate any Program changes required and avoid project delays



## **Staff Recommendation**

Projects using the agent subscription model are not eligible to participate in the Program for the following reasons:

- CSP already provides primary Model benefits through ratepayer investment
- Would create additional risks for participants
- Would create additional risks and complexity for the Program
- Would create specific, additional barriers for low-income participation
- And would result in additional ratepayer costs

## Stakeholder Feedback

- Staff appreciates comments from the following stakeholders:
  - Common Energy, Arcadia, Oregon Solar + Storage Industries Association (OSSIA), Oregon Shines, Portland General Electric, PacifiCorp, and CUB
- OSSIA, Arcadia, Common Energy, PGE, and CUB submitted comments after Staff's recommendation.
  - OSSIA requested narrowing Staff's recommendation; sought clarity on how recommendation would impact existing projects and on revising CPS contracts
  - Arcadia requested specific Commission order language
  - Common Energy argued Model benefits and disputed Staff's recommendation
  - PGE reiterated its support for Staff's recommendation
  - CUB reiterated its support for Staff's recommendation
