

Commission Standard of Review and Action

- Commission standard for DSP Plans: Acceptance
- Requires Plan to meet all Guidelines; does not indicate reasonableness of investments
- From <u>Order No. 20-485</u>





Staff Recommendation

- Accept the Distribution System Plan Part Two filing by PGE as meeting the criteria and requirements of the DSP Guidelines
- Suspend the 2023 Smart Grid Report filings



Selected Staff Findings

Investment Planning

- More insight than in past
- Limited project details hamper understanding of decision making and how projects connect to the process

Non-Wires Solutions

- Two pilots the Company recommends exploring further
- Innovative initial work on valuation

DER Forecasting + Grid Transparency

- Adoption forecast to feeder level
- How investments align with TE adoption forecast, sensitivity to adoption scenarios
