## UM 2225 Investigation into Clean Energy Plans

## Docket Announcement-Resilience and Community Lens Workstream

HB 2021 establishes an ambitious emissions-based clean energy framework for electricity providers in Oregon.<sup>1</sup>

This announcement describes Oregon Public Utility Commission (OPUC or Commissions) Staff's continued work on Clean Energy Plans, particularly as it relates to the requirement to include within a clean energy plan "a risk-based examination of resiliency opportunities that includes costs, consequences, outcomes and benefits based on reasonable and prudent industry resiliency standards and guidelines established by the Public Utility Commission". A resiliency workshop was held, and information provided by the Department of Energy's Grid Modernization Lab Consortium regarding many aspects pertinent to resiliency across the country. This announcement includes links to a <u>resilience</u> <u>questionnaire</u> to ensure any outstanding questions DOE could provide insights into are shared. Please note that the survey is optional, but will advise of any potential further industry information important to consider.
