Re: AR 638 Risk-based Wildfire Protection Plans rulemaking comment period

Dear Filing Center:

This correspondence is in regard to the AR 638 Risk-based Wildfire Protection Plans rulemaking. The Oregon Joint Use Association (OJUA) respectfully requests that the deadline to submit comments on the draft rules be extended beyond October 18, 2021.

OAR 860-028-0200 requires establishing a Joint-Use Association to advise the Commission on adoption, amendment, or repeal of administrative rules governing pole owners and pole occupants. The OJUA is recognized as the organization representing both pole owners and users in compliance with 860-028-0200. The OJUA Board represents a diverse set of entities engaged in providing energy and telecommunications services throughout Oregon. The OJUA Board believes that the diversity of entities and their views requires more time for comment than afforded by the current schedule.

The work of preventing wildfires is important and the OJUA pledges not to burden the proceeding by extending the schedule unnecessarily. However, in previous proceedings the comments of the OJUA have been viewed by the Commission as useful and adding valuable insight to the conversation.<sup>1</sup> The OJUA Board believes that if allowed the additional time to provide comments that reflect its diverse membership's views that all parties will find OJUA's comments insightful.
