The Issue

Idaho Power Company (IPC) in an effort to comply with <u>OAR 860-025-0030(2)(f)</u> sent two letters to landowners with procedural schedules that were never accurate or correct. The timing of both letters to landowners was sent **before** the preconference scheduling conference, where the schedule was to be discussed and set. These actions seemed to be intentionally misleading (at worse) or highly confusing (at best). IPC and its experienced attorneys had to know the schedule they proposed would be adjusted. So why did they do this **twice** before the preconference scheduling conference?

On September 1, 2022 IPC sent this letter Re: <u>Docket No. PCN-5 – Idaho Power Company's Notice of Intent to</u> <u>File a Petition for Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity</u> via post to addressed to all landowners and to this docket via the service list. STOP asserts that IPC did not comply with <u>OAR 860-025-0030(2)(f)</u> since they made matters more confusing and misinformed the landowners they were to inform. This created frustration and un-necessary anxiety, rather than bringing clarity to the situation. In doing so they took away the landowners rights to a fair and just process.

## **Request for Relief**

STOP would like IPC to write another letter to all persons who have interests, known or of record, in the land to be physically impacted or traversed by the proposed route (aka landowners). The letter should contain but not be limited to:

- 1. An explanation to landowners why they received 2 letters with incorrect proposed procedural schedules before the scheduling conference and why that was never corrected;
- A more robust section with information for participating in the proceeding (see non-robust: <u>Sept 1,</u> <u>2022 Tim Tatum letter p 5 of 5</u>) and include STOP B2H's contact information and web site in that section;
- 3. The letter is reviewed with editorial suggestions from the landowner interveners in PCN 5. If editorial differences cannot be resolved by the intervener parties and IPC the ALJ may name a third party to determine best language.

- 4. Idaho Power pay a fine for intentionally misleading landowners by publishing proposed schedules knowing that the preconference scheduling conference would not occur until October 11, 2022. The fine should be payable to a special fund administered by STOP or another independent entity to assist landowners in finding legal representation.
- 5. This docket, PCN 5, be suspended for at least 30 days. Time is needed to compile the letter with editorial comments and be mailed to the landowners with adequate time for them to make decisions and ask for help. Interveners and staff have indicated this expedited docket is moving to quickly towards an artificial deadline created by IPC which is at the expense of involving all those that may like to be involved.

## Compliance with the PUC's rules on motions<sup>1</sup>

STOP has not had the opportunity to comply with <u>OAR 860-001-0420</u>(2). Intentions were to file this motion and several others at the beginning of the New Year. Research was ongoing developing these motions so that a good faith effort to confer with other parties to seek agreement about the subject of the motion could occur. ALJ Mellgren's December 19, 2022 memorandum expedited the filing of this Motion for proper notification of Landowners.
