14	extension for PacifiCorp's next round of testimony on these same issues (from July 17 to July

23	None of these parties object. Staff was not successful in reaching the other parties to the docket			
24	in time to note their positions on this motion.			
25	Staff asks for the extension of time because it needs additional time to complete and			
26	finalize its testimony regarding the environmental compliance upgrades to Pacific Power's coal

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1	units. Whether the compliance upgrade at the Bridger coal plant (Unit 3) was prudent is at issue		
2	in Idaho Power's general rate case, Docket No. UE 233. Due to the complexity and the

4	of testimony requires a significant amount of Staff resources. Staff currently has a very large		
5	caseload. Accordingly, Staff needs additional time in which to complete the testimony in this		
6	case, as well as the testimony regarding investment in the Bridger Unit 3 coal plant upgrade		
7	presented in Idaho Power's general rate case.1		
8	Staff requests expedited consideration of this motion under OAR 860-001-420(7). Staff		
9	also requests that the administrative law judge shorten the time for response.
