12	suspend portions of the procedural schedule in this docket, pursuant to OAR 860-001-0420, to		
13	allow Staff of the Public Utility Commission of Oregon, Oregon Citizens' Utility Board, Alliance		
14	of Western Energy Consumers, and Avista Corporation ("the Parties") time to prepare and file		
15	stipulation and supporting testimony with respect to the settlement-in-principle. Counsel for Avista		
16	has conferred with counsel for the other Parties. All Parties to this docket support this Motion.

Under the current procedural schedule, Avista's reply testimony is due August 7, 2019. Because the Parties have reached an agreement-in-principle on a comprehensive settlement resolving all remaining issues, it renders this and other prefiling and briefing dates moot. The Parties, however, wish to preserve the hearing date of October 3, 2019, as set aside on the existing schedule, in the event that the Commission wishes to entertain live testimony in support of the Stipulation. Accordingly, all other scheduled dates would be vacated, and the Parties would commit to filing the Stipulation and supporting testimony no later than August 14, 2019.

¹ The Parties previously entered into a Partial Settlement Stipulation that was filed on July 3, 2019, resolving among themselves issues surrounding cost of capital and interest rate hedging. By virtue of this settlement-in-principle, once reduced to writing and executed, all remaining issues will have been resolved, subject to Commission approval.
