| 5  | support of the request and to expedite any discovery in this proceeding. Good cause exists to issue a  |
| 6  | Protective Order to protect commercially sensitive and confidential business information related to  |
| 7  | the Company's request for a general rate increase. In support of this Motion, the Company states:  |

| 10 | The Commission's rules authorize Avista to seek reasonable restrictions on discovery of  |
| 11 | sensitive commercial information and other confidential business information. See OAR 860-001-   |
| 12 | 0080(3)(a) (adopting Oregon Rules of Civil Procedure ("ORCP")); ORCP 36(C)(7) (providing   |
| 13 | protection against unrestricted discovery of "trade secrets or other confidential research,  |
| 14 | development, or commercial information"). See also In re Investigation into the Cost of Providing  |
| 15 | Telecommunication Service (UM 351), Order No. 91-500 (1991) (recognizing that protective orders  |
| 16 | are a reasonable means to protect "the rights of a party to trade secrets and other confidential   |

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2. 3 Avista anticipates that parties to this docket may request proprietary cost data and models, 4 commercially sensitive load and resource projections, confidential market analyses and business 5 projections, confidential employee data, and confidential information regarding contracts for the 6 purchase or sale of natural gas. This confidential business information is of significant commercial 7 value, which would expose the Company to competitive injury if disclosure is unrestricted. 8 9 3. 10 It is substantially likely that Staff and other parties in this proceeding will seek to discover 11 information held by Avista, including confidential business information. "The Commission's 12 standard blanket protective order is designed to facilitate discovery in cases involving discovery of 13 large numbers of documents." See In re Portland Extended Area Service Region, Docket UM 261, Order No. 91-958 (1991). Issuance of a protective order will facilitate the production of relevant 14 15 information and expedite the discovery process. 16 17 4. 18 The Company requests expedited consideration of this Motion to allow parties who execute 19 the protective order to obtain prompt access to the confidential exhibits and workpapers in support of the Company's request for a general rate increase and to expedite any discovery in this 20 21 proceeding. In addition, in making its general rate filing, Commission rules require the submission 22 of responses to a set of standard information requests (see OAR 860-022-0019), and some of such

- 23 responses contain confidential information.
