9	Staff of the Public Utility Commission of Oregon ("staff") asks the administrative law		
10	judge to indefinitely postpone tomorrow's due date for simultaneous opening comments in UM		
11	1452 to allow parties to confer about potential jurisdictional limitations on the Commission's		
12	ability to establish Volumetric Incentive Rates ("VIR") in the pilot programs required by House		
13	Bill 3039. Staff also asks for expedited consideration of the motion because the simultaneous		
14	opening comments are due tomorrow. Staff relies on the points and authorities below.		
15	POINTS AND AUTHORITIES		
16	Under House Bill 3039, the Commission is required to establish pilot programs to		
17	determine the use and effectiveness of VIR for energy generated by customers of investor-owned		
18	utilities and sold to the investor-owned utilities. However, the Commission's jurisdiction to		
19	establish such prices appears to be limited by federal law. Under the Federal Power Act, the		
20	Federal Energy Regulatory Commission ("FERC") has exclusive authority to establish prices for		
21	wholesale sales of electricity in interstate commerce. ¹		
22	Staff has presented parties with a straw proposal that assumes no limitation on the		
23	Commission's jurisdiction to establish VIR, and parties are scheduled to comment on that		
24	proposal in simultaneous opening comments due on December 18, 2009. However, staff intends

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1	to provide parties with a description of the limitations on the Commission's jurisdiction to set		
2	rates for sales for resale in interstate commerce and to provide a potential regulatory route to		
3	avoid FERC preemption.		
4	Accordingly, staff proposes that the administrative law judge indefinitely postpone		
5	tomorrow's due date for simultaneous opening comments to allow staff an opportunity to inform		
6	the parties of the reasoning underlying its concerns regarding jurisdictional limitations and to		
7	describe potential regulatory routes to avoid FERC preemption. Staff intends to provide this		
8	information to the UM 1452 and AR 538 parties by close of business on Monday, December 21,		
9	2009.		
10	Counsel for staff did not contact parties regarding this motion. Staff only recently		
11	concluded that the potential jurisdictional limitations were significant and learned this afternoon		
12	that several parties are still working on their opening comments. In fact, one party has filed an		
13	unopposed motion to postpone the due date for the comments until December 22, 2009. Given		
14	the late-breaking nature of the developments described above and the looming due date for		
15	comments, staff counsel did not have opportunity to contact all parties to ascertain their position		
16	regarding the motion.
