Application to Lower the Standard Price and Standard Contract Eligibility Cap for Solar Qualifying Facilities. MOTION FOR EXTENSION OF TIME EXPEDITED CONSIDERATION REQUESTED

Pursuant to OAR 860-001-0420, Portland General Electric Company ("PGE") hereby submits this motion for an extension of time to file its compliance report required in Commission Order No. 17-310 in the above captioned proceeding.

In Order No. 17-310, the Commission directed PGE to provide monthly reports on the progress of its contracting process with solar qualifying facilities ("QFs"). The Commission requires the reports to be filed at the beginning of each month until it resolves PGE's underlying request for permanent relief in the docket. PGE currently has approximately 100 QF applications in its queue, 92 of which are solar. PGE desires to provide complete and comprehensive information for each solar QF application in the compliance report. This means the initial report is taking a significant amount of time to prepare. In addition, the same employees preparing the report are processing the applications for PPAs (which show no signs of abating) and responding to over 30 complaints filed by QF developers. Accordingly, PGE requests that the Commission allow it until September 29, 2017 to submit the first required compliance report and rule that each subsequent report is due at the end of the month thereafter.

PGE has consulted with the parties. Commission Staff supports PGE's request for an extension. CREA and Strata Solar Development, LLC oppose PGE's request. No other party has indicated either opposition or support of the extension.

PGE requests expedited consideration of this motion.

For the reasons state above, PGE moves the Commission for an Order extending the time

to submit the first required compliance report to September 29, 2017, and ruling that each

subsequent report is due at the end of the month thereafter.
