Pursuant to ORS § 756.525 and OAR § 860-001-0300(2), the Alliance of Western Energy Consumers (“AWEC”) hereby petitions the Oregon Public Utility Commission (“Commission”) to intervene in this proceeding with full party status as described in OAR § 860-001-0010(7). 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3. AWEC is an incorporated, non-profit association of large energy consumers in the Western United States, with offices in Portland, Oregon. Many members of AWEC are customers of PacifiCorp, dba Pacific Power (“PacifiCorp” or “Company”).

4. On February 3, 2020, PacifiCorp filed its Oregon Transportation Electrification Plan, as required by Section 20(3) of Senate Bill 1547, codified at Oregon Laws 2016, Chapter 028, Sections 20 and 29, and pursuant to the Commission’s Order No. 19-134 in Docket No. AR 609. The Company plans to propose cost-based rates that promote transportation electrification that could have a direct bearing on the rates paid by AWEC’s members who purchase power and/or delivery services from PacifiCorp. AWEC therefore requests leave to intervene in this Docket to represent its members who are affected by any change to PacifiCorp’s rates and programs.

5. AWEC represents the interests of a number of large customers served by PacifiCorp in Oregon. AWEC also has significant experience participating in proceedings involving PacifiCorp’s rates and programs. AWEC’s intervention in this proceeding will assist the Commission in resolving the issues in this proceeding and will not unreasonably broaden the issues, burden the record, or unreasonably delay this proceeding.

6. As described above, AWEC has a direct and substantial interest in this proceeding that will not be adequately represented by any other party and may be affected by any Commission determination made in connection with this proceeding. It is in the public interest to allow AWEC to intervene in this proceeding.

WHEREFORE, AWEC respectfully requests that the Commission grant its petition to intervene with full party status in this proceeding.
