Pursuant to OAR 860-027-0300, ORS 757.259 (3), ORS 757.072, and the Oregon Public Utility Commission (the "Commission") Intervenor Funding Order Nos. 03-388, and the latest reauthorization, OPUC Order 10-342, which approve Portland General Electric Company's ("PGE's") Intervenor Funding Deferral. PGE requests reauthorization to defer for later ratemaking treatment certain intervenor funding costs. PGE seeks reauthorization to defer and amortize intervenor funding costs, as described below, for a 12-month period commencing July 1, 2011.

I. Deferral History:

On July 2, 2003, the Commission issued Order No. 03-388 approving temporary rules specifying the qualifications for certifying intervenor eligibility for funding under SB205, and the conditions for terminating their certification. Pursuant to the Intervenor Funding Act, the Commission issued Order No. 03-388 that approved an agreement between PGE, Pacific Power and Light (dba PacifiCorp), Northwest Natural Gas Company, Northwest Industrial Gas Users, Citizens' Utility Board of Oregon ("CUB"), and Industrial Customers of Northwest Utilities ("ICNU"), dated February 3, 2003 (the "Intervenor Funding Agreement"). The Intervenor Funding Agreement specifies the terms and conditions for intervenor funding grants, the funding amount to be contributed by each utility, the procedures for budget submittals by intervenors, the need for

Commission approval of budgets, and the payment of grants by utilities into three funds, which include the CUB Fund, the Pre-authorized Matching Fund, and the Issue Fund.

On July 14, 2003, the Commission issued Order No. 03-405 authorizing payment of \$50,000 by each of the three participating utilities in the CUB Fund.

On August 11, 2003, PGE filed an application with the Public Utility Commission for an accounting order authorizing PGE to defer its costs related to the Intervenor Funding Grants through June 30, 2004. Staff's recommendation, to authorize PGE to defer the costs, was approved and adopted by the Commission on September 11, 2003, in Order No. 03-561.

PGE filed and received reauthorization for this deferral, as shown in Table 1 below

On December 19, 2007, the OPUC approved the First Amended and Restated Intervenor Funding Agreement ("IFA") that extended intervenor funding through December 12, 2012 (OPUC Order 07-564). The restated IFA amends and clarifies the use of funds for dockets that extend over two or more calendar years, modifies some of the original terms and conditions, adds new reporting

requirements and changes the funding amounts to be contributed by each utility, as well as adds new accounts for additional participating utilities.

Pursuant to Commission Orders listed above, PGE respectfully requests an Order reauthorizing the deferral for later rate-making treatment, of all payments made by PGE between July 1, 2011 and June 30, 2012, to intervenors under the three intervenor funds established under the IFA.

II. OAR 860-027-0030 Requirements:

The following is provided pursuant to ORS 860-027-0300(3):

a. <u>Description</u>

For the 12-month period of July 1, 2011 through June 30, 2012, PGE seeks reauthorization to continue recording, in a deferred account, all amounts it is required to pay to the CUB Fund, the Pre-authorized Matching Fund, and the Issue Fund.

b. Reasons for Deferral

OPUC Order No. 03-561 authorized PGE's accounting process for the grant funds. Some previously paid grant funds are currently being deferred pursuant to OPUC Order No. 09-268, but the Order is about to expire and PGE requests that the deferral continue. Moreover, PGE requests additional amounts it is required to pay to the three funds during the period of July 1, 2011 through June 30, 2012, to be treated similarly.

PGE will continue to incur Intervenor Funding expenses until December 12, 2012, pursuant to the IFA adopted in OPUC Order No. 07-564. PGE wishes to continue to use the deferral mechanism as approved. Without reauthorization, the current authorization to defer costs will expire on June 30, 2011.

c. Proposed Accounting

Fund:

PGE proposes to record all deferred costs in FERC Account 182.3 (Other Regulatory Assets).

d. Amounts Subject to Deferral and Estimates of Amounts

PGE anticipates the maximum amounts to be deferred, during the 12-month period subsequent to the filing of this Application, are¹:

PGE estimates the following balances to exist in its intervenor funding accounts:

PGE began amortization of these funds through Advice 07-029, which became effective January 1, 2008. 2011 amortization is occurring through PGE Advice 10-22A (Schedule 105).

The IFA permits intervenors to request grants from the various funds at any time during the calendar year, though the deferral periods have generally run from July 1 to June 30. Amounts will be debited to the deferral account as funds are actually disbursed. *See* OPUC Order No. 03-561,

² Approximate balance not considering interest accruals, full amortization and exact payout dates.

³ Balance does not reflect 2012 accrual.

Appendix A, Page 3. Balances in the funds may rollover into the following year if intervenors do not use the entire amount available, and some funds (the CUB and Matching Funds) permit intervenors to request advances from future-year funds.

Pursuant to the terms of the IFA, individual fund costs will be allocated to the appropriate customer class: the CUB fund will be charged to residential customers; the Pre-authorized Matching Fund (ICNU) will be charged to industrial customers, and the Issue Fund costs will be aligned and allocated to keep the intended beneficiaries of the advocacy undertaken on their behalf.
