In the Matter of the Application of Portland General Electric Company for an Order to Reauthorize the Deferral of Information Technology Costs APPLICATION FOR REAUTHORIZATION TO DEFER INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY COSTS

Pursuant to ORS 757.259, OAR 860-027-0300 and OPUC Order No. 01-777 (Appendix B, Item S-45, pages 8-9), Portland General Electric Company ("PGE") requests reauthorization to defer for later ratemaking treatment certain information technology costs ("IT Deferral" or "Deferred Amount"). PGE seeks reauthorization to defer information technology costs as described below from January 1, 2007 through December 31, 2007 (the "Deferral Period"). PGE is currently amortizing through Advice No. 05-19.

I. Deferral History

In OPUC Docket UE-115, PGE entered into a Stipulation regarding cost of service changes that was approved by the Commission in Order No. 01-777 (Appendix B to the Order). The Stipulation requires that PGE compare the revenue requirement of certain IT capital expenditures included in base rates in UE-115 to the revenue requirement based on actual expenditures.

The Stipulation also required an OPUC Staff audit of the actual expenditures to determine if the expenditures were reasonable and prudent. OPUC Staff completed the audit of the relevant IT capital expenditures made from 2000 to 2003 in February 2004. The Stipulation further requires that the 2003 True-Up accrue to the deferred account in each subsequent year

until new base rates are established. Finally, as a component of the Stipulation, PGE has agreed to waive any earnings test, if needed, to implement a rate refund.

a. 2002 True-up

PGE compared the actual IT capital revenue requirement for 2002 to the amount placed in base rates in UE-115 and established that it had underspent IT capital by an amount equivalent to \$7.5 million in revenue requirements. PGE established a customer credit of \$7.5 million that was refunded to customers from November 2002 to December 2003.

b. <u>2003 True-up</u>

PGE compared the actual IT capital revenue requirement for 2003 to the amount placed in base rates in UE-115. PGE estimated that it had underspent IT capital by an amount equivalent to \$4.3 million in revenue requirements. On December 30, 2003, PGE filed for authorization to defer the \$4.3 million in revenue requirements for 12 months beginning January 1, 2004. The Commission approved the deferral in OPUC Order 04-169. PGE amortized this credit during 2004. Subsequent to the OPUC Staff audit, the 2003 deferral amount was determined to be \$4.2 million. This credit amount was then amortized in 2005 and 2006 per Commission Orders No. 05-126 and 06-438.

c. 2003 True-up Continued to 2006

Because new base rates have not been established, customers will be owed \$4.2 million based on the actual revenue requirement associated with decreased capital expenditures through December 31, 2003, compared to the amounts used in the UE-115 test year. PGE requests reauthorization to defer this amount beginning January 1, 2007. PGE will amortize this credit during 2007.

II. OAR 860-027-0300 Requirements

The following is provided pursuant to OAR 860-027-0300(3):

a. Description

For 2007, PGE has determined that customers are owed \$4.2 million based on underspending on capital IT projects through December 31, 2003 relative to the amounts used in UE-115.

b. <u>Reasons for Deferral</u>

PGE seeks reauthorization of the IT Deferral pursuant to a stipulation in UE-115 and approved by the Commission in Order No. 01-777. In accordance with the Stipulation requiring that each January 1st an amount equal to the 2003 True-Up be deferred in a balancing account, PGE is filing this reauthorization application for the period January 1, 2007 through December 31, 2007. Without reauthorization, this deferral will expire on December 31, 2006.

c. Proposed Accounting

PGE proposes to record the deferral as a regulatory liability in FERC Account 254, debiting FERC Account 449.1 (Provision for Rate Refunds). In the absence of a deferred accounting order, PGE would absorb the Deferred Amount in its retail revenues (FERC 440, 442, and 444).

d. Estimate of Amounts

PGE will refund \$4.2 million resulting from the 2003 True-Up. Consistent with the stipulation, the actual 2003 True-Up will accrue to the deferred account on January 1, 2007 and will accrue interest at PGE's authorized cost of capital, currently 9.083%.
