Pursuant to ORS 757.259 and OAR 860-027-0300, and OPUC Order No. 06-584, Portland General Electric Company ("PGE") requests reauthorization to defer Certain Expenditures associated with the Bonneville Power Administration's Conservation Rate Credit described below, for a 12-month period commencing October 1, 2007.

I. <u>Deferral History</u>

On August 28, 2006, PGE filed an application with the Oregon Public Utility Commission ("OPUC"), requesting authorization for a deferred account to track revenues and expenses associated with the Bonneville Power Administration's ("BPA's") Conservation Rate Credit ("CRC"). The OPUC issued an Order, authorizing the deferral on October 17, 2006, Commission Order No. 06-584. The approval was conditioned upon PGE providing a detailed plan for use of the Bonneville Power Administration Conservation Rate Credit monies that result in a reduction of PGE's operational costs. PGE provides a semi-annual report regarding its investments associated with CRC funds. The latest report is Attachment "A".

On May 21, 2007, the BPA suspended the Residential Exchange Program ("REP"), including the CRC. PGE then suspended CRC-related payments to the ETO pending resolution of the REP.

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II. OAR 860-027-0300(3) Requirements

The following is provided pursuant to OAR 860-027-0300(3):

a. <u>Description</u>

While the REP is currently suspended, PGE expects the program to be reinstated within the next 12 months. PGE intends to qualify for CRC reimbursement through the qualified activities of PGE and, reinstatement of funds sent to the ETO. In the absence of this reauthorization, if PGE is required to refund to BPA amounts granted through the CRC, or if PGE is unable to receive CRC reimbursement for amounts spent on its own activities. There is a possibility that PGE might not have the ability to recover the expenses from customers.

b. <u>Reasons for Deferral</u>

PGE seeks deferred accounting treatment of certain expenditures funded by the Conservation Rate Credit and received from BPA. PGE would seek amortization of these expenses in the event that PGE is required to return them to BPA. This deferral is necessary to appropriately match the costs borne by and benefits received by customers. ORS 757.259(2)(e). The funds that PGE sends to the ETO will be used for conservation and energy efficiency projects that benefit all PGE customers by reducing load, thereby minimizing the need for new supply-side resources and providing greater long-term rate stability. PGE would only request amortization of expenses associated with projects that directly benefit PGE customers, and would expect to provide specific details about those programs when and if PGE requests amortization.

c. <u>Proposed Accounting</u>

PGE proposes to record deferred amounts related to CRC expenditures to FERC Account 182.3 (Regulatory Assets), and will credit FERC Account 232 (Accounts Payable), a current

In the absence of deferred accounting, expenditures not funded by the CRC would be debited to the appropriate O&M account based on the type of expenditure.

d. Estimate of Amounts

PGE expects to receive the CRC funding from BPA and thus does not expect a balance in the deferred account. Since the CRC is currently suspended, PGE cannot provide an estimate of the deferral amounts. However, the deferral amounts could be up to \$2.5 million annually if the BPA reinstates the CRC to the same level as existed previously.

PGE hereby submits its semi-annual report on the Bonneville Power Administration (BPA) Conservation Rate Credit (CRC) fund activity for the period between April 1, 2007 and September 27, 2007. OPUC Order No. 06-584 directed PGE to "provide detailed information regarding its investments associated with the CRC funds in a semi-annual report, detailing activities that have been funded through the CRCs in order to prevent the possibility of double-recovery in a future ratemaking proceeding and to demonstrate that these investments are not redundant to programs offered by the Energy Trust of Oregon."

Receipts related to CRC activity are recorded in a CRC Liability account (FERC 232). Year to date, PGE received \$1,227,522 for CRC activities from BPA. No additional CRC amounts have been received from BPA after March 31, 2007 due to suspension of the Regional Power Act benefits by BPA. From the CRC liability account, PGE forwarded \$550,000 to ETO as well as incurred \$57,022 in support of ETO's incremental energy efficiency efforts. As of September 27, 2007 the CRC liability account carries a balance of \$620,500. Attachment - A contains a description of PGE's incremental activity in support of ETO's energy efficiency programs. Attachment - B contains a summary of the transaction activities since inception.

This report is our second submittal and reflects limited activity as PGE implements CRC related efforts.

Customer Technical Services (CTS) CRC semi-annual report

The activities undertaken were incremental and not included in the costs in the test period filed in UE-180 rate case. The process of identifying and hiring incremental resources was not complete until December 1, 2006, at which time CTS began a concerted effort to provide enhanced support for ETO programs. The initial accounting of 181-N42526-XX-516-24476-CRCOP was changed to 181-J14824-XX-516-24476-CRCOP on March 21, 2007 to better differentiate it from other N42526 activities.

2006/2007 Fiscal Year Administrative Budget: \$150,000

Cumulative YTD Administrative Costs: \$57,022

As of May 31, 2007 CTS activities resulted in the submission of 15 projects to the ETO and the identification of 30 potential projects. The customer base ranged from small to large office and retail, including representation from both the private and government sectors. The potential projects varied in size and complexity, from small lighting and HVAC to chiller and central plant upgrades.

In addition to identifying capital projects eligible for ETO incentives, CTS was also able to identify "no cost' modifications that customers have implemented. These included improving lighting sweep set points, DDC control modifications and simple programmable thermostat adjustments to reduce energy consumption during non-business hours.
