29	This Application is filed pursuant to ORS 757.259, which empowers the Commission to			
30	authorize the deferral of expenses or revenues of a public utility for later incorporation into rates.			
31	In support of this Application, the Company states:			

Avista provides natural gas service in southwestern and northeastern Oregon and is a public utility subject to the Commission's jurisdiction under ORS 757.005(1)(a)(A).

BACKGROUND

In May 2021, the Governor of Oregon signed into law HB 2475, the Energy Affordability Act. Among other provisions, this bill amends ORS 757.230(1) to provide that utilities may take into account the "differential energy burdens on low-income customers and other economic, social equity or environmental justice factors that affect affordability for certain classes of utility customers" when designing rates, and provides utilities with the opportunity to offer a bill discount to income-qualified eligible residential customers. Avista's proposal for providing a low-income bill discount program to eligible residential customers, in alignment with HB 2475, was approved by the Commission on July 26, 2022 in Docket No. ADV 1410/Advice No. 22-03-G. With that approval, Avista received support "to defer all costs associated with the proposal in its existing deferral authorization, as approved by the Commission on March 22, 2022, in Docket No. UM 2232, Order No. 22-099."

Accordingly, the Company has tracked and recorded all costs associated with the implementation and administration of all modifications made to its Low-Income Rate Assistance Program (LIRAP) as a result of ADV 1410, with such costs deferred effective February 10, 2022, pursuant to the Commission's previous authorization of this deferral in Order No. 22-099 of Docket No. UM 2232. The authorization for deferred accounting treatment as described herein can be authorized by the Commission pursuant to ORS 757.259(2)(e).

DESCRIPTION OF DEFERRAL

Presently, Avista records the costs to operate and administer the LIRAP Bill Discount and associated LIRAP modifications approved in ADV 1410 in FERC account 908 (Customer Assistance Expenses), with recording and tracking of the deferred amounts in FERC account 182.3 (Other Regulatory Asset). Pursuant to Order No. 22-099 in this docket, the deferral account accrues interest at the Modified Blended Treasury rate (MBT), even without contemporaneous cost recovery. A summary of the accounting entries recorded by Avista is as follows:

PROPOSED ACCOUNTING

In this Application for reauthorization, Avista is not proposing any change to the current deferral accounting. The Company would like to continue to record and track the funds as described above and expects to further address cost recovery of these deferred balances with a rate adjustment proposal in Q3 of 2023.

CURRENT DEFERRAL BALANCES

At December 31, 2022, the total balance in the Regulatory Asset for Energy Affordability Act implementation account (FERC account 182.3), was \$219,732. For illustrative purposes, since

WHEREFORE, Avista Utilities respectfully requests that the Commission reauthorize the Company to defer for later rate-making treatment any costs associated with HB 2475 for the 12-month period, February 10, 2023 through February 9, 2024. The Company is not proposing an adjustment to customers' retail rates through this Application, but rather will seek recovery of the deferral and a proposed level of revenues to support the LIRAP Bill Discount and associated LIRAP modifications in a future proceeding. Pursuant to OAR 800-027-0300(3)(e)(6), a copy of the Notice of Application and list of persons served with the Notice is attached to this Application as Exhibit A.
