SUBJECT: PORTLAND GENERAL ELECTRIC: (Docket No. ADV 110/Advice

No. 15-21) Revises Schedule 115, Low Income Bill Payment Assistance

Fund, to Extend Temporary Increase.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION:

Staff recommends the Commission authorize Portland General Electric's (PGE or Company) Schedule 115 tariff revisions, as described in Advice 15-21, effective October 5, 2015. Staff also recommends that the Commission grant PGE's request for waiver of the statutory notice period.

Issue

FROM:

Should PGE be allowed to extend the Company's collection of its share of the \$5 million annual temporary increase for low-income bill assistance for an additional 24 months? Staff recommends that this filing be approved.

Applicable Rules, Orders and Statutes

Section 1(7)(b) of Senate Bill (SB) 461 (Chapter 837, Oregon Laws 2007) requires electric companies in Oregon to establish a rate to collect approximately \$15 million dollars per year, starting in 2008 for low-income bill assistance. SB 863 (Chapter 566, Oregon Laws 2011), Section (3)(1) required the Commission to direct electric companies to collect and disburse an *additional* combined total of \$5 million per 12-month period from residential customers for a maximum of two periods, based on a determination by Oregon Housing and Community Services (OHCS) that certain criteria had been met. The Commission approved these temporary adjustments for two consecutive 12-month periods ending October 4, 2013. House Bill (HB) 2004 (Chapter 254, Oregon Laws 2013), Section (3)(1) extended the temporary collection of the combined total \$5 million for an additional 24 months. HB 2004 also eliminated the

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special economic conditions as the determinate for the collection or disbursement of these additional funds. The Commission approved the temporary adjustments for two consecutive 12-month periods ending October 4, 2015.¹

Subsequently, the legislature passed HB 3257 in the regular 2015 Oregon Legislative Session, extending the sunset date of the supplemental low income assistance to January 2, 2018.

Discussion

PGE filed Advice No. 15-21 on September 24, 2015, with an effective date of October 5, 2015, and a request for waiver of the statutory notice period. The filing implements the 24-month extension of the temporary increase required by HB 3257 as discussed above.

The rate for the additional funds was calculated jointly with Pacific Power. The current rate of \$0.34 per month will stay the same based on 2016 projected residential customer counts for PacifiCorp and PGE. PGE will continue to collect approximately \$3 million of the \$5 million per year from residential customers through October 4, 2017. This amount, when combined with the regular Schedule 115 rate of \$0.50 per month, extends the total collection of \$0.84 per residential customer per month. PGE's forecast of residential customers for 2016 estimates that approximately 750,000 will continue to pay this temporary increase.

Staff has reviewed the Company's filing and is supportive of this modification.

PROPOSED COMMISSION MOTION:

PGE's revised Schedule 115, filed as Advice No. 15-21, go into effect October 5, 2015, and the statutory notice waiver be granted.
