For each question, the Commission would like to hear first from the utilities and then from parties and Commission Staff.

- 1. As stated in Order No.11-172, the Commission wants utilities to systematically evaluate potentially beneficial smart grid opportunities on an ongoing basis and implement those that make sense for consumers. The process possibilities range from periodic reporting by utilities to comprehensive Smart Grid Plans. What process should the Commission use and why?
- 2. For each of the smart grid substantive issue areas posed in Order No. 11-172 for workshop discussions, including the issue added by the parties (specifically, privacy, cyber-security, interoperability requirements, the role of utilities in home energy management, and consumer education), are there any issues or sub-issues within these five substantive areas that you believe require Commission guidance through rules or guidelines, and why? What areas require no guidance and why?

3. In this docket, should the Commission identify the factors it will consider when analyzing cost recovery requests for smart grid investments? If yes, what factors should we consider?
