On April 16, 2020, Commission Staff filed a partial schedule in this proceeding that includes a Commission Special Public Meeting on Thursday, July 2, 2020, to consider approval or disapproval of a final draft Request for Proposal (RFP). This notice contains the call-in information for the teleconference due to the ongoing COVID-19 conditions, and an agenda for our discussion.

PARTICIPATION: To help us organize the teleconference, we request that

AGENDA:

- 1. PacifiCorp is asked to make introductory remarks on its draft RFP, with an overview of how it has complied with OAR 860-089-0250, our rule on Design of Requests for Proposals.
- 2. The Independent Evaluator (IE) is asked to summarize the remaining disputed terms or issues with the RFP. Staff and parties will be asked to explain the remaining conditions

- they seek to have included in our order on approval of the RFP, and PacifiCorp may provide responses.
- 3. Time permitting, we will engage PacifiCorp, Staff, and the IE in discussion of questions raised by the Commissioners, Staff, or others, including the following:
 - Transition Close Date of January 31, 2020 (also referred to as the cutoff date):
 - o If a FERC order on rehearing changes the cutoff date, and the FERC order is issued after July 6, 2020, how would PacifiCorp modify the RFP?
 - o If a FERC order on rehearing does not change the cutoff date, does PacifiCorp have a proposal for how it could consider bids from these projects in time for Commission review of the final shortlist?
 - <u>Next Commission Review:</u> PacifiCorp's RFP schedule shows the initial screening/ranking will be developed in September and the initial shortlist in October, just prior to the cluster study.
 - Please discuss what level of Commission and stakeholder engagement is contemplated during the initial screening/ranking process and the creation of the initial shortlist, including the potential timing of that engagement.
 - Please discuss whether such engagement will be paired with PacifiCorp's implementation of the Commission's directive in Order No. 20-186 for a
 September 2020 summary of the specific terms of sensitivities that will highlight futures having fewer off-system sales due to lower market prices.

• Models and Scoring:

- Please discuss the values or metrics that will be produced and analyzed with the initial screening/ranking versus the initial shortlist.
- O Can the initial screening/ranking include a view of the bids ranked by price and non-price score, in addition to the modeled results based on an hourly shape?
- Please explain how the rankings may shift after applying the hourly shape.

• Future Developments:

 Please address how PacifiCorp will consider freed-up transmission from retiring coal plants. Will that transmission be addressed in another cluster study or another RFP?
