DISPOSITION: MOTIONS TO ALLOW LATE FILINGS GRANTED

On August 22 and 24, 2006, Portland General Electric Company (PGE) filed separate motions to allow late filings. Both filings seek approval for the late filing of stipulations and supporting testimony. In its August 22nd motion, PGE seeks approval for the late filing of a stipulation and testimony addressing direct access issues. In its August 24th motion, PGE seeks approval for the late filing of a stipulation and testimony addressing the company's resource valuation mechanism (RVM). The stipulations and testimony were scheduled to be filed on August 21, 2006, but not submitted until the date PGE made the respective motions. PGE explains that both stipulations and testimony took longer than anticipated to complete, but contends that no party will be prejudiced by the late filings.

PGE's motions to allow the late filings are granted. As PGE explains, each stipulation was either supported or unopposed by all active parties that participated in the direct access or RVM settlement discussions. Accordingly, there is no reason to expect that any party will be prejudiced by allowing the late filings.
