DISPOSITION: MOTION GRANTED

On June 29, 2007, Portland General Electric Company (PGE) served a motion requesting a change in the schedule of this proceeding. PGE asks that the date for filing of its opening testimony be postponed three weeks – “because Systems Acceptance Testing of the proposed AMI project has been pushed back due to a delay in delivery by the vendor of the necessary software.” PGE reports that other parties do not oppose its motion.¹

PGE states that it commits to work with the other parties to propose a revised schedule. If the parties are not able to agree, PGE states that it will notify the Commission and request a scheduling conference.

I grant PGE’s motion to postpone the date for filing its opening testimony. Rather than set a new date at this time, I direct PGE to confer with the parties regarding scheduling, including the date for PGE’s opening testimony. If the parties do not agree to a schedule, PGE may decide when its opening testimony will be submitted, and I will set the remainder of the schedule after conferring with the parties.
