DISPOSITION: MOTION FOR RENEWAL OF ADMISSION PRO HAC VICE GRANTED

On April 4, 2013, the Chief Administrative Law Judge issued a ruling granting the admission of Kurt J. Boehm and Jody Kyler Cohn *pro hac vice* on behalf of Fred Meyer Stores, a subsidiary of the Kroger Co. and Quality Food Centers (Kroger), in the above captioned docket. On May 5, 2014, I issued a ruling that granted a motion for renewal of the admission *pro hac vice* of Kurt J. Boehm. On May 14, 2015, Mr. Boehm filed a motion for renewal of his admission *pro hac vice*. The motion includes new documentation, including an affidavit by Mr. Boehm, copies of Certificates of Good Standing from each jurisdiction in which Mr. Boehm is licensed to practice, and a Certificate of Liability Insurance verifying that the applicant is licensed to practice. The motion is filed by Nona M. Soltero, an active member in good standing with the Oregon State Bar with whom Mr. Boehm has been associated.

I have reviewed the motion for renewal of admission *pro hac vice* and find that it complies with the requirements of UTCR 3.170 and OAR 860-001-0320.

The motion to renew admission of Kurt J. Boehm *pro hac vice* on behalf of Kroger is granted subject to the condition that no pleading opposing its motion is filed before the close of business on May 21, 2015.
