DISPOSITION: PETITION TO INTERVENE AND MOTION TO ADMIT COUNSEL PRO HAC VICE GRANTED

On June 17, 2014, the COMPETE Coalition (COMPETE) made two filings: 1) a petition to intervene; and 2) a motion to admit counsel *pro hac vice*.

Petition to Intervene

The petition indicates that COMPETE is a coalition of 765 diverse electricity stakeholders, including 39 members having 779 facilities in Oregon who have an interest in these proceedings. No party objected to the petition.

Upon review of its petition, I find that COMPETE has sufficient interest in the docket to participate and that its participation will not unreasonably broaden the issues, burden the record, or delay the schedule.¹ The petition to intervene is therefore granted.

Motion to Admit Counsel Pro Hac Vice

William L. Massey filed a motion to appear as counsel *pro hac vice* on behalf of COMPETE in this proceeding. In the motion, Mr. Massey states that he will associate with Irion Sanger, an active member in good standing with the Oregon State Bar.

I have reviewed the motion for admission *pro hac vice* and find that it complies with the requirements of UTCR 3.170 and OAR 860-001-0320. No objections have been received. The motion is granted.
