
DISPOSITION: MOTION TO ADMIT *PRO HAC VICE* GRANTED

On April 10, 2014, Fred Meyer Stores, a subsidiary of the Kroger Co. and Quality Food Centers (Kroger), filed a motion to allow Kurt J. Boehm and Jody Kyler Cohn to appear as counsel *pro hac vice* in this proceeding. The affidavits of Mr. Boehm and Ms. Cohn accompanied the motion. Mr. Boehm and Ms. Cohn state that they will associate with Nona M. Soltero, an active member in good standing with the Oregon State Bar.

I have reviewed the motion for admission *pro hac vice* and find that it complies with the requirements of UTCR 3.170 and OAR 860-001-0320. The period for any party to oppose the motion has passed and no oppositions to the motion have been received. The motion to admit Kurt J. Boehm and Jody Kyler Cohn *pro hac vice* on behalf of Kroger is therefore granted.

Parties are reminded that for cases continuing over one year, attorneys appearing *pro hac vice* must annually file a new application to continue to participate in the case.<sup>1</sup>
