DISPOSITION: PROCEDURAL SCHEDULE MODIFIED/ REQUEST FOR ORAL ARGUMENTS GRANTED

On July 21, 2004, I received a letter from PacifiCorp indicating that Citizens' Utility Board (CUB), Staff and PacifiCorp, but not Industrial Customers of Northwest Utilities (ICNU), have reached a stipulation in this matter. PacifiCorp further states that Ms. Kelly, Mr. Hellman and Mr. Jenks will be available for testimony regarding the stipulation at the August 5, 2004, hearing. Finally, CUB, Staff and PacifiCorp ask that the record be kept open until August 16, 2004, to receive any objections other parties may have to the stipulation.

OAR 860-014-0085(5) provides that any party may file written objections to the stipulation or may request a hearing. Because ICNU objects to the stipulation, I am waiving the requirement that ICNU file written objections or request a hearing. Rather, I am using the previously scheduled hearing date of August 5, 2004, to include a hearing on the stipulation. ICNU can place its objections to the stipulation on the record and present its evidence. I will determine at the hearing whether the record needs to remain open.

ICNU has also requested oral argument before the Commission. ICNU's request is granted. The schedule in this docket is now as follows:
