DISPOSITION: JOINT MOTION TO MODIFY PROCEDURAL SCHEDULE GRANTED

On August 4, 2021, Waconda Solar, LLC and Portland General Electric Company filed a joint motion requesting a modification of the current procedural schedule. The parties state that good cause exists to issue the requested ruling because it will facilitate the parties' efforts to return to litigation in an orderly manner.

RULING

A party may request oral argument subsequent to PGE's submission. A prehearing conference may be scheduled as needed or as requested by the ALJ or the parties.
