MEMORANDUM ESTABLISHING
SPECIAL PUBLIC MEETING

Parties are requested to take no more than 5 minutes to summarize key issues and provide additional clarification regarding their written comments. Commissioners may have

questions and responses related to those questions that may result in the use of additional time.

For comments with multiple signatories, one or more representatives may be selected to provide summary comments. Any subsequent commissioner questions can be responded to by the representative requested by the Commissioners or selected by the group.

Any remaining time in the afternoon SPM, as well as all time in the evening SPM, will be allocated to public comment from any interested person. At the beginning of the meeting, the Commission will use the “raise hand” feature in the Zoom platform to identify the number of speakers and set time limits to best accommodate as many comments as possible.
