On May 20, 2004, a prehearing conference was held. Appearances were entered on behalf of PacifiCorp, Staff, Industrial Customers of Northwest Utilities (ICNU), and Citizens' Utility Board (CUB).

Unless otherwise noted, the filing dates are "in-hand" with hard copies received by Administrative Hearings Division.

The parties further agreed to a schedule for data requests, which is as follows:

1. All data requests are to be responded to within five business days, unless otherwise noted below.
2. Data requests made between May 20 and July 2 that require extensive analysis can be responded to in more than five, but not more than ten, business days.<sup>1</sup>

3. Data requests made to Staff regarding its July 2, 2004 testimony and to intervenors regarding their July 9, 2004, testimony must be submitted by July 10, 2004, and answered by July 16, 2004.
4. Data requests for any rebuttal testimony filed on July 20, 2004, shall be submitted by July 22, 2004, and answered by July 26, 2004.
