DISPOSITION: PETITION TO INTERVENE GRANTED; SCHEDULE ESTABLISHED

On January 29, 2008, a prehearing conference was held in the above-captioned docket. The following parties entered appearances: Stephanie Andrus and Kelcey Brown on behalf of the Public Utility Commission of Oregon Staff (Staff); Douglas Tingey and Patrick Hager on behalf of Portland General Electric Company; Michelle Mishoe on behalf of PacifiCorp, dba Pacific Power (Pacific Power); and Allen Chan on behalf of the Industrial Customers of Northwest Utilities (ICNU).

ICNU filed a Petition to Intervene on January 14, 2008. The time for objecting to the petition has passed, and no objections to the petition were received. I find that ICNU has sufficient interest in the proceeding and that its appearance and participation will not unreasonably broaden the issues, burden the record, or unreasonably delay the proceeding. *See* OAR 860-012-0001. ICNU's Petition to Intervene is granted.
