PURPOSE OF UM 2011

Per the April 23, 2019 Commission Order (Order No. 19-155), this proceeding will investigate "capacity" (generally) to develop a broadly applicable methodology for valuing capacity. During Phase III, Staff, the utilities, and stakeholders will work to develop appropriate method(s) to calculate a value for capacity, and present these recommendations to the Commission. Based on the Order:

- Methodologies could be consistent across utilities, but based upon the value to each utility's system, and
- Methodologies may need to vary by resource type / characteristics.

GOALS OF THIS PHASE III WORKSHOP

- Gain a better understanding of context and possible options:
 - Other Oregon PUC dockets, programs, and models which propose some form of capacity value
 - o Examples of what some other jurisdictions have done
- Discuss possible options for methodologies, components, and factors to consider
