RE: <u>Docket No. UE 283</u> – In the Matter of PORTLAND GENERAL ELECTRIC COMPANY, Request for a General Rate Revision.

Staff is correcting two numerical errors in Staff/300. The first error is to change the stated 2015 postage increase from 2.7% to 1.7%. Staff correctly identified the postage increase in both the original work papers and elsewhere in the originally filed exhibit of June 11, 2014. The second error corrects the calculated mailing expenses under the assumption that the exigent postage increase is made permanent. Staff's originally filed mailing expense number does not match Staff's calculations.

The errors are on page 35, line 21. Attached for filing are a redline and corrected version of page 35.

The Committee approved an amended version of the bill on February 6, 2014. Postal unions and commercial mailers maintain opposition to the bill.
- Q. Should expectations regarding 2015 postage rates be based on current law or proposed legislation?
- A. Postage rates should be based on current law. There are 8,553 bills and resolutions before the US congress and approximately 5% of these bills are expected to be made law.²⁰ Given the current opposition to this bill, the low probability that this bill will be made law, and the fact that relevant portions of the bill are subject to further changes, basing postage rates on the proposed bill is highly speculative.
- Q. If this legislation becomes law prior to the resolution of the current rate case, what is Staff's proposed mailing expense adjustment?
- A. If the legislation becomes law as written Staff expects the Postal Service to maintain the 2014 exigent rate increase and apply a 2015 rate increase of 21.7%. This results in mailing expense of \$3,639,5913,604,826. If the bill is

- Q. If this legislation becomes law prior to the resolution of the current rate case, what is Staff's proposed mailing expense adjustment?
- A. If the legislation becomes law as written Staff expects the Postal Service to maintain the 2014 exigent rate increase and apply a 2015 rate increase of 1.7%. This results in mailing expense of \$3,604,826. If the bill is substantially altered prior to passage Staff recommends revising these calculations.
