RE: Second Supplemental Filing of Advice No. 18-07, Deposits for Residential Customers

Portland General Electric Company (PGE) submits this filing pursuant to Oregon Revised Statutes (ORS) 757.205 and 757.210, and Oregon Administrative Rules (OARs) 860-022-0025 and 860-022-0030, for filing proposed tariff sheet associated with Tariff P.U.C. No. 18. PGE initially filed Advice No. 18-07 on April 20, 2018 with a requested effective date of the later of May 14, 2018 or the next business day after the new billing system comes online, which remains as originally filed. PGE then supplemented the filing on April 23, 2018, to correct the deposits for Multiple-Family Dwellings, (any other combination) from the filed \$60 to \$90 to comply with OAR 860-021-0205 and our billing system set-up. Given our recent decision to request a waiver of OAR 860-021-0205, PGE is now submitting this Supplemental Filing to revert the Multiple-Family Dwellings, (any other combination) back to the original \$72.

After discussions with Staff, PGE will also be filing concurrently a waiver of OAR 860-021-0205 to allow deposit installments in amounts less than \$30.

To satisfy the requirements of Oregon Administrative Rules 860-022-0025(2) and 860-022-0030(1), PGE provides the following responses:

OARs 860-022-0025 and 860-0022-0030 require that PGE submit a statement of the tariff schedule change, the number of customers affected, the change in revenue, and the grounds supporting the change. With regard to identifying the number of customers affected and change in revenue, Schedule 310 contains a list of the deposits for residential service, therefore, it is unknown how many residential customers will need this schedule and the revenue change is therefore unknown.

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Due to the requested effective date and the less than 30 days-notice, the application requesting a waiver of legal statutory notice, pursuant to ORS 757.220, and OAR 860-022-0020 that was submitted with the original filing, is still valid.

The purpose of this schedule is to list the deposits for residential service referred to in Rule D of the General Rules and Regulations.

The deposit amounts represent one-sixth (1/6) of average annual bills for the various dwelling types. When one-sixth (1/6) of the actual annual bill for a particular dwelling is significantly greater or less than the average deposit listed, the Company may request a deposit amount that more accurately represents one-sixth (1/6) of the anticipated annual usage.
