Re: Withdrawal of Tariff Advice No. 15-09 – Rule I, Budget Pay Plans


Attention Filing Center:

On June 4, 2015, Idaho Power Company (“Company”) filed its advice to make changes to Rule I, Budget Pay Plans.

In the advice filing, the Company requested to update its Rule I to require residential customers have a minimum of nine months of billing history before being eligible to enroll in the Budget Pay Plan. Subsequent to filing Tariff Advice No. 15-09, Public Utility Commission of Oregon Consumer Services Program Manager Phil Boyle contacted Regulatory Analyst Zach Harris and discussed that Equal-Payment Plans, as described in OAR 860-021-0414, do not establish a minimum length of billing history as eligibility criteria for residential customers to enroll. Due to this discussion, and to be compliant with OAR 860-021-0414, the Company withdraws this advice filing.
