DISPOSITION: MONETARY PENALTIES ASSESSED

On October 19, 2001, the Public Utility Commission of Oregon filed a complaint against Defendant. The complaint charged Defendant with one violation of law.

Defendant was notified in the complaint, served on October 26, 2001, that failure to answer or otherwise appear within 20 days after service would be deemed a default. Furthermore, all material allegations of the complaint would be deemed admitted, hearing waived, penalties imposed, and the matter disposed of by appropriate order without further notice. From the foregoing, it is concluded that Defendant is in default, all material allegations of the complaint are deemed admitted, hearing waived, and that, pursuant to ORS 757.993, civil monetary penalties should be assessed against Defendant in the amount of \$1,000.

IT IS ORDERED that:

- 1. Civil monetary penalties in the amount of \$1,000 are assessed against Mealue Excavating, Inc., (an Oregon Corporation).
- 2. Defendant shall pay the sum of \$1,000 due and payable within 30 days from the date of service of this order.
