DISPOSITION: APPLICATION GRANTED; WITH CONDITIONS

On May 1, 2002, the Public Utility Commission of Oregon (Commission) received a supplemental application from Portland General Electric Company, pursuant to ORS 757.495, requesting to renew its affiliated interest transactions through September 30, 2003 with Portland General Transport (PGT).

Based on a review of the application and the Commission's records, the Commission finds that the application satisfies applicable statutes and administrative rules. At its Public Meeting on May 7, 2002, the Commission adopted Staff's recommendation, with conditions, to approve PGE's current request. Staff's recommendation is attached as Appendix A and is incorporated by reference.

OPINION

Jurisdiction

ORS 757.005 defines a public utility as anyone providing heat, light, water, or power service to the public in Oregon. Portland General Electric Company is a public utility subject to the Commission's jurisdiction.

CONCLUSIONS

1. The Company is a public utility subject to the jurisdiction of the Public Utility Commission of Oregon.
2. An affiliated interest relationship exists between Portland General Electric Company and Portland General Transport.
3. The supplemental application appears to be fair and reasonable and not contrary to the public interest.

ORDER

IT IS ORDERED that the supplemental application of Portland General Electric Company requesting approval to renew its affiliated interest with Portland General Transport through September 30, 2003, is granted, subject to the conditions stated in Appendix A.
