DISPOSITION: MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING ACCEPTED; IMPROVEMENT PLAN APPROVED WITH REPORTING REQUIREMENTS

At the March 21, 2002 public meeting, Staff presented to the Public Utility Commission of Oregon (Commission) a report recommending Qwest Corporation (Qwest) be assessed penalties in the amount of \$255,000 for violation of statutory service quality standard between January and December 2001, as required under ORS 759.450 (Appendix A). The Commission concluded that the penalties be applied to upgrading remote testing capabilities at selected Digital Loop Carriers (DLC) locations. The Commission directed Staff to identify the DLCs that would be modified.

At the public meeting on May 7, 2002, Staff and Qwest presented a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) to the Commission (Appendix B). The MOU sets forth the penalties to be paid by Qwest and identifies the targeted DLCs that will be modified. The Commission accepted the MOU, adopted Staff's recommendation, and approved Qwest's Performance Plan. Staff's Report and the MOU are attached as Appendices A and B, and incorporated by reference.
