DISPOSITION: MOTION FOR APPROVAL OF MODIFIED PROTECTIVE ORDER GRANTED

On June 21, 2002, Portland General Electric Company (PGE) filed a Motion for Approval of Modified Protective Order (MPO). PGE requests the use of a MPO to facilitate the discovery and dissemination of confidential information in this docket. PGE anticipates that the Commission Staff and other parties will request materials containing confidential and proprietary information. PGE states that the MPO is designed to protect confidential customer information, protect confidential business plans and strategies, and reduce disputes regarding the distribution of confidential information in this docket

In order to facilitate the exchange of confidential information, we find that good cause exists to issue a MPO for use in this docket. Accordingly, PGE's motion is granted. The MPO, attached as Appendix A, shall govern the disclosure of confidential information in this case. Parties desiring receipt of confidential information shall sign the Consent to be Bound Form set forth on page 6 of Appendix A.

In reaching this decision, we acknowledge that this docket has yet to be formally presented to the Commission. Consequently, there are no parties at this stage to respond to PGE's request. For that reason, the Commission may reconsider this ruling in the event that subsequent intervenors object to the protective order.
