DISPOSITION: CANCELLATION ORDER RESCINDED

On June 14, 2001, the Commission granted a certificate of authority to Global Crest Communications Inc. (Global) to provide telecommunications service in Oregon as a competitive provider. *See* Order No. 01-483. Oregon telecommunications providers are required to provide requested information to the Commission. After investigation, the Commission found that Global failed to comply with Oregon Universal Service Fund requirements per ORS 759.425. At the July 23, 2002, public meeting, the Commission determined that Global's certificate of authority should be canceled. Global's certificate of authority was canceled in Order No. 02-536.

On September 12, 2002, Global filed a request to suspend Order No. 02-536, claiming that it had complied with the Commission's rules and regulations. A review of the Commission's records indicates that Global filed the requested information on August 20, 2002.

The information sent by Global to the Commission was late. However, the information has been received and it indicates Global is providing telecommunications service in Oregon. Under the circumstances, the cancellation of Global's certificate should be rescinded.

ORDER

IT IS ORDERED that Order No. 02-536 canceling the certificate of authority of Global Crest Communications Inc., is rescinded.
