ORDER

DISPOSITION: CANCELLATION ORDER RESCINDED

On February 18, 1997, the Commission granted a certificate of authority to Telco Partners Inc. (TPI) to provide telecommunications service in Oregon as a competitive provider. *See* Order No. 97-056. Oregon telecommunications providers are required to provide requested information to the Commission. After investigation, the Commission found that TPI failed to comply with Oregon Universal Service Fund requirements per ORS 759.425. At the July 23, 2002, public meeting, the Commission determined that TPI's certificate of authority should be canceled. TPI's certificate of authority was canceled in Order No. 02-506.

On October 1, 2002, TPI filed a request to suspend Order No. 02-506, claiming that it had complied with the Commission's rules and regulations. A review of the Commission's records indicates that TPI filed the requested information on September 30, 2002.

The information sent by TPI to the Commission was late. However, the information has been received and it indicates TPI is providing telecommunications service in Oregon. Under the circumstances, the cancellation of TPI's certificate should be rescinded.

ORDER

IT IS ORDERED that Order No. 02-506 canceling the certificate of authority of Telco Partners Inc., is rescinded.
