DISPOSITION: DOCKET CLOSED

On June 7, 2002, the Public Utility Commission of Oregon (Commission) opened this rulemaking docket to consider a proposal by the Industrial Customers of Northwest Utilities to amend the electric restructuring rules by adding language regarding an "opt-out" provision. During the meeting, several participants suggested that this docket needed to be expanded to allow conversation about revising other SB 1149 rules. The Commission decided to consolidate this docket with another electric restructuring rule docket, AR 417. That consolidation occurred on July 1, 2002.

After holding workshops and submitting comments in the consolidated dockets, the participants determined that the issues raised in AR 441 could be resolved without new administrative rules.¹

On December 2, 2002, the Administrative Law Judge asked the participants in Dockets AR 417 and AR 441 if there was any need for further proceedings in AR 441, and if they had any objections to AR 441 being closed. The participants were asked to respond by December 18, 2002. No one responded. Therefore, this docket should be closed.
