**DISPOSITION: CANCELLATION ORDER RESCINDED**

On January 9, 2002, the Commission granted a certificate of authority to Main Street Telephone Co. (MSTC) to provide telecommunications service in Oregon as a competitive provider. *See* Order No. 02-027. Oregon telecommunications providers are required to provide requested information to the Commission. After investigation, the Commission found that MSTC failed to comply with Oregon Universal Service Fund requirements per ORS 759.425. At the October 15, 2002, public meeting, the Commission determined that MSTC's certificate of authority should be canceled. MSTC's certificate of authority was canceled in Order No. 02-752.

On November 5, 2002, MSTC filed a request to suspend Order No. 02-752, claiming that it had complied with the Commission's rules and regulations. A review of the Commission's records indicates that MSTC filed the requested information on April 22, 2003.

The information sent by MSTC to the Commission was late. However, the information has been received and it indicates MSTC is providing telecommunications service in Oregon. Under the circumstances, the cancellation of MSTC 's certificate should be rescinded.

**ORDER**

IT IS ORDERED that Order No. 02-752 canceling the certificate of authority of Main Street Telephone Co., is rescinded.
