**DISPOSITION: ORDER NO. 03-408 AMENDED; EXTENSION GRANTED**

In Order No. 03-408, the Commission adopted a Staff report recommending Demand Response Programs for Portland General Electric Company (PGE) and PacifiCorp. Among other things, that report required the utilities to provide an assessment to the Commission that evaluates demand response potential by market segment, identifies barriers to development, and recommends action. The utilities were required to file the report by December 31, 2003.

On December 30, 2003, PacifiCorp and PGE requested a two-week extension to file the report. The utilities state that they have developed a joint draft report but need additional time to finalize it. The Commission Staff does not object to the request.

We treat the request as a motion under ORS 756.568 to amend Order No. 03-408, and grant it. Order No. 03-408 is amended to allow the requested extension. PacifiCorp and PGE must submit the report by January 16, 2004. The remainder of Order No. 03-408 remains unchanged.

**ORDER**

IT IS ORDERED that Order No. 03-408 is amended to allow the requested extension of until January 16, 2004 to file the report.
